



# Winter Along the Highway Ice Storm, November 1921 Troutdale and Columbia River Gorge





A snow and ice storm raged through the Columbia River Gorge in November 1921. It dropped 54" of snow in The Dalles, 37.5" in Hood River and 27.5" in Cascade Locks. It stranded 63 passengers on an Oregon Washington Railroad & Navigation train for three days near Bridal Veil. To keep the passengers warm, the steam engine needed to keep running. A pipeline to feed water to the engine was laid to the Bridal Veil Lumber Company three-quarters of a mile away. The passengers were fed with cheese, crackers, bologna, bread, canned meat, and coffee. A phonograph appeared and a party atmosphere ensued with music and dancing. After three days they were rescued and brought to Portland.

The storm hit Troutdale in the form of ice. The storm blanketed buildings and streets with a thick sheet of ice, dragging down power lines and trees.




# **Date Estimation for Postcard**

# Friends in History Remembered

#### Yolanda Gloria Cereghino Nusser - b. July 16, 1930, d. July 7, 2022

Yolanda was born on July 16, 1930 to Ernest "Stephen" & Elizabeth "Lizzie" Cereghino. The Cereghino family, who immigrated from Italy, grew vegetables on a farm east of Troutdale Road from 1930 to 1970s. Yolanda married Gerald "Linn" Nusser on May 11, 1958. They had three children - Dan, Julie, and Dori.

Yolanda graduated from Troutdale Grade School in 1944. She was a faithful member of the Troutdale Historical Society since 2011.

#### Ella Louise Dix - b. August 1, 1924; d. November 1, 2022



One of the few remaining Troutdale berry farmers, Louise Dix, died this past November. She was born in Gresham on August 1, 1924 to Ezra and Alice Wall. She met her future husband, Bob Dix, at Gresham High School, both graduating in 1942. They were married on October 2, 1943 in Pocatello, Idaho.

While Bob served in the Navy, Louise worked at a bank in LaJolla, California. When Bob was shipped out to sea, Louise returned to Gresham and continued to work in banking. The skills she learned during this time served her well in later years. Upon Bob's release from the Navy, they tried farming in Pleasant Home, Oregon, but after a few years they moved to Troutdale and purchased 40 acres on the ridge above the Sandy River that overlooked the Columbia River. It was a parcel of land that was once grazing land for cattle of nearby homesteaders. It would become a prosperous berry farm for over 40 years.

Louise Dix

Louise and Bob had three children - Kathy Louise Green, Julie Ann Bybee, and Robin Jeffry. Raising three children did not stop Louise from helping out. With kids in tow, she would work alongside Bob in the fields. She kept records of every expenditure and income leaning on her skills from her banking years. During the 1950s and 60s, they employed many local teenagers during berry picking season.

In 1968 Louise, Bob, and her mother in-law Louella, became charter members of the Troutdale Historical Society. Louise remained a faithful supporter of THS all her life. Ever the watchful bookkeeper, she was known to pay her membership dues in advance to make sure they were paid.

As a mother of three, grandmother of eleven, and great-grandmother of twenty-five, she was greatly loved and admired. They say she was known to always have three things in her purse - Wrigley's Doublemint gum, pink lipstick, and tissues.

Louise loved to travel, play golf, bird watch, crossword puzzles, ice cream and strawberries, and was a season ticket holder to Trail Blazer games, and a Mariner fan.

After the tragic loss of Robin (1984) and Julie (1995) a memorial trail was commemorated. "Robin's Way" trail leads from the Harlow House through Harlow Canyon up to what was their berry farm. It is now Strawberry Meadows subdivision, built 1996-1999.
