Sharon Nesbit to Speak About Troutdale History

The Troutdale Historical Society is proud to have Sharon Nesbit as the featured speaker at the April 15 meeting.

Sharon will be speaking about Troutdale history and her much anticipated new book, It Could Have Been Carpdale, Centennial History of Troutdale, Oregon, due out sometime late summer or early fall. The book has 11 chapters and more than 200 photographs. It covers Troutdale's beginnings, transportation, it's birth as a new boom town in 1891, schools (including the Bealey Military Academy), the people who lived in Harlow House and the town's prominent businesses and industry including the Bissinger Wool Pullery. It also includes chapters on town government (with fond portraits of Glenn Otto and Sam Cox), farming and the Multnomah County Poor Farm, smelt runs, weather from ice storms to snow to floods, and life in Troutdale in the churches and organizations.

100 Years Ago

Troutdale ~ When the petition was filed with the Multnomah County Court (August 2007) to Incorporate Troutdale as a city, "the number of inhabitants now residing within the limits of the above described territory is about 450...

In an ordinance approved by the city council on Oct 8th, 1907, "It is hereby made unlawful for any person under the age of 16 to be in or remain upon any of the streets or other public places in the town of Troutdale after the hour of 9 o'clock p.m. from the first day of March to the 31st day of August, inclusive of any year, or after the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. from the 1st day of September to the last day of February...unless such person is accompanied by parent"...

Centennial Arch

Downtown, a Centennial Arch will be built spanning Historic Columbia River Highway, as a permanent monument commemorating Troutdale's Centennial. The City of Troutdale has already committed \$45,000 toward the arch. A time capsule will be buried as part of the arch project.

The 100 Year Celebration Committee is seeking \$250,000 in tax-deductible donations from businesses and the public to complete the arch. We have already received one-third of the funds in pledges and in-kind contributions. All donations are welcome and all donor's names will be permanently recorded in the archives of the Troutdale Historical Society and in the time capsule.

Donors (in dollars or in-kind valuation) at the Salmon, Trout and Smelt Levels will have their names (up to 30 characters) permanently displayed on a plaque and included in the time capsule, plus receive other acknowledgements as follows:

<u>Salmon Level</u> -- \$25,000 and above -- Name of donor, prominently, on its own line, on the plaque + bronze artwork, acknowledging gift, created by Troutdale artist Rip Caswell.

<u>Trout Level</u> -- \$10,000 to \$24,999 -- Name of donor, prominently, 2 names per line, on the plaque + framed picture of Centennial Arch acknowledging gift.

Smelt Level -- \$1,000 to \$9,999 -- Name of donor, 4 names per line, on the plaque + certificate acknowledging gift.


2007 Tea & Tour


