AND HOW DID WE DO AT HARVEST FAIRE



Fifty families squeezed their own cider. More than 400 people signed the Harlow House guest register. Eight antique dealers and 35 craft booths owners took part. Tad's served about 500 chicken and dumpling dinners.
