

In Memory

Lois Schulte, former Gresham-Troutdale resident, died in Milwaukie on Dec. 1.

Lois was a longtime member of the Troutdale Historical Society and played Mrs. Santa to her late husband Ted who played Santa at Harlow House museum for more than 25 years. She also had been membership secretary of the historical society and was once honored as member of the year.

Lois married Ted in Sandy in 1973. He preceded her in death in 2000. She worked at the shipyards during World War II and was a secretary for Standard Insurance in Portland for many years. She later worked for the City-County Council on Aging.

Lois was also a member of the Troutdale Lions Club and St. Henry's Catholic Church.

Judge Truly Wright passed away on Dec. 2 at the age of 96. She was once Troutdale City hall's only worker and also served as the city's municipal judge. She shared space on the lower floor of city hall with the jail and the city tractor.

In 1965 when she began work, the late Glenn Otto was mayor and Troutdale had 450 residents. When she retired in 1974 the population in Troutdale had grown to 2,365 and the city hall staff had increased to 9. Truly and her husband Acil lived in Wood Village for many years. Later in her career the city council appointed her judge, gave her an official title and a black robe.

Betty Wieprecht died at her home on Dec. 3rd. She and her husband Harvey are longtime members of the Troutdale Historical Society.

Betty was born and educated in Portland, graduating from Jefferson High School in 1943. She later earned her nursing degree from what is now Legacy Emanuel Hospital & Health Center and graduated first in her class for the entire state of Oregon. She worked at Emanuel for more than 30 years and retired in 1987.

Betty was also a member of Smith Memorial Church, Job's Daughters and the Mazamas, She volunteered with Meals on Wheels and Camp Fire USA.

Sally Lindholm, longtime beloved teacher at Troutdale Elementary School died in Boise, Idaho on Dec. 12. She began teaching in Troutdale in the early 1940,s and continued to keep in touch with several of her former students through the years. She retired in the mid-1970, s.

Sally married her husband Arthur in 1938. He worked and retired from the postal service in Portland. He preceded her in death in 1993. Her son Eric died in 1998 and her daughter Tina and family live in Boise. She was a member of musical group, the *Postal Notes*, consisting of postal employee wives. They became very popular and played many venues as far away as Seattle.

Sally volunteered for the U. S. post office for many years answering letters to Santa Clause. When she moved to Boise in 2001, they had no "Santa" program in place in the Boise area. She wrote to the post office in Portland and they sent her an average of 100 letters, which she continued to answer by hand until Christmas of 2004.

Don Hessel died in Gresham on Dec. 6. He and his wife Mary Jo opened Main Street Grocery in downtown Gresham in 1982 and operated the business in the old Miller-Kidder Hardware Store location. He retired for health reasons 18 years later.

Don was a fourth generation member of a family that originally settled in Gresham in 1908. He was very active in community affairs as president of the Gresham downtown boosters and its Spirit of Christmas event. He volunteered for meals on wheels, listened to children read in the Heart tutoring program and volunteered with the Portland Jazz Festival, just to name a few. Don was a longtime member of Troutdale Historical Society offering many years of goods and advice.

Anniversary

Orlin and Barbara Huston, longtime Troutdale residents, celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary on December 14th in Yuma, AZ. They will have a celebration with family when they come to Oregon next summer.

They met on a blind date in August of 1946 and went dancing at the pavilion at Blue Lake Park. The couple lived most of their lives in East County including Wood Village, Corbett and then Troutdale.

Orlin retired from the Troutdale Post Office in 1980 and Barbara retired from Nationwide Insurance in 1981. Barbara also played piano for Reynolds School District for many years. They moved to Yuma in 1981 and then worked several summers in Yellowstone Nation Park. Barbara plays organ for their church in Yuma and Orlin enjoys shooting pool.
